From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone.

It's Holy Week and I want to stay focused on God's love for us. In the past when I was very young, mom would make simple meals to help keep things focused on what was important. I remember meals of pancakes and bean soup. The next meal might be bean soup and corn bread. Another meal might be just bean soup with no ham in it at all. You would think that I would not like bean soup, but I still love it as it brings back memories of our family sitting together around a big table in preparation for Easter. Mom and dad would always remind us kids of the sacrifice Jesus made for us and that our little sacrifices were little compared to how much Jesus loved us as He walked the way of the cross and would die on the cross for us. Maybe bean soup still sounds good during Lent because the alternatives were sardines, smelt, tuna casserole or little bony sunfish caught right out of a polluted creek. Whatever the meal might have been, as a family we thought of how everything came back to God's love for us.

This week I began jury duty. I thought immediately about the First Station of the Cross: Jesus is condemned to death. It was strange to hold a person's future in your hands, if the case would go to trial or not. And yet that is what we are called to do as Jesus' family: to be so involved in each other's lives as to call someone our neighbor. Love calls us to be involved with each other. Love called the Father to send the Son to be involved in our lives so that we could be involved with His...forever. As new cases were presented, I heard Jesus' words come to the forefront. I heard that I did not come to condemn. Part of the jury duty was to go to the jail. It was not a pleasant experience. I prayed for current inmates and past ones who need healing, forgiveness, and peace. I found going to jail a prayerful experience. With Holy Week on the horizon Jesus and Holy Week were not far from my thoughts.

With this week being Holy Week, I am asking everyone to get involved. Enter into fasting. Enter into prayer. Enter into our celebrations in church. Enter into the love which Jesus would live and die for. The services are beautiful and full of things to reflect upon. Make plans to attend. Make plans to take in the love of God. Make this a Holy Week. Fr. Mark




