Thoughts from Fr. Mark

Happy Easter, everyone. Easter continues, as does the dealing with the coronavirus. It seems like the virus has taken over more than the physical health of the world. For some people, lives have been put on hold. First Communions, Proms, Senior Trips, Weddings and Baptisms have either been postponed or even canceled. In sports, Opening Day with the Reds or Tigers or Indians is put on hold. Going to State in basketball, track, baseball or softball are only dreams. Walking for graduation from college is now a virtual thing. In New Zealand, when times are like this, it is called "Wonky."

I have to say that, compared with other Easter celebrations, my spiritual life is "Wonky," also. I've had a lot to pray about and I do, but it surely doesn't seem like Easter. I've had people to pray for, from the youngest who needs surgery or delivered healthy, to unexpected health needs, such as flare-ups with cancer or terrible infections. I've prayed for lots of people I don't know, such as people in nursing homes and people outside of nursing homes who can't be visited. I've prayed for people, near and far, who have lost their sense of normal due to job loss or fear. I've prayed for Fr. Elmer because he has to deal with me. I have to say that this Easter has been a time of more prayer than most Easters.

But...I want some sense of Easter to the full. I want to be like Mary Magdalene, who is surprised in the garden when she recognized the risen Jesus. I want to be like the disciples who recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread at Emmaus. I want joy! I've realized that, with the coronavirus, life has been heavy and not lighthearted. My prayer life has been heavy, also. I have prayed about heavy things and that is good, but not always healthy for a good prayer life.

And so...I went turkey hunting this morning. I got to see first light. I got to hear robins rustling the leaves and chirping that there would be rain later in the day. I heard the riveting sound of woodpeckers of many varieties, as they searched for breakfast. I watched a raccoon dance across a log, as it crossed a small creek. I heard blue jays sound the alarm that deer were passing close by my camouflaged position. I took in the small delicate spring flowers as they promised a new growing season. I was purposely giving myself permission to have joy. I put this article on hold for a little Easter joy. I put on hold meetings about when First Communion would be. I gave myself permission to tell people that I don't only work about my faith...I enjoy it. And for those people who need some joy, I would be like Mary Magdalene. I would be an ambassador or resurrection. For all those people whose lives are Wonky, I can be that person who has seen the Lord and shares some joy. If I am to get back to normal, I need some balance of lightheartedness and heaviness. I believe that is what the disciples had to go through as they had to deal with Jesus' death and resurrection. They would miss Him and were so glad for Him and themselves. But what that might look like, they were unsure. I think that is us today with the coronavirus pandemic. Now we have to figure out what life beyond the virus will look like. Surely, if we are people of the resurrection, it has to deal with joy.

So my message this week is to think of joy. Have it, share it, celebrate it. I've got that joy, joy, joy down in my heart. I might have to wear pink again.

Have an Easter week. Let the joy on the Risen Lord fill the world. And, by the way, I did not get a turkey. I went out with a sling shot. The turkeys were happy, also.


