Happy Easter. Easter turned out to be nice, inside and out. From the outside, the weather was nice and there was definitely enough candy. Food was good and our churches looked beautiful. The singing was great and every seat was taken. Bonnets were worn and pictures taken. From the outside, Easter couldn't have been better.

Last night I met with those who joined the Catholic Church. Like the first disciples on their way to Emmaus, their hearts were burning. I asked them what they liked about the Easter services, especially Holy Saturday. For one it was the candles. To be one of the people who brought light to others, in the midst of darkness, impressed that person. Jesus is the light of the world and He asks us to be real lights to others. This person was amazed that he got to be one of the people, although new, to show Jesus to others. For two others, it was the end of the celebration that touched their hearts. As parishioners came up to welcome them, they could feel the oneness of the Church and what Jesus wanted for us. There was a sense of hospitality and warmth. People from Kalida and Continental joined in belief and love of the Lord. It was a beautiful Holy Week, inside and out.

On Monday, I took a day to visit Holmes County. Again, there was beauty inside and out. As a person who sees God in nature, I took in beauty all day. I saw deer, turkeys, hawks, lambs, colts and calves. I saw rolling hills and blue skies. I saw and smelled freshly-plowed ground. It was wash day and seeing clothes on the line brought me back to my mom washing loads of laundry in a ringer washer and then hanging out the "warsh." I think that mom's clothes lines were just as full as the Amish families. The bare feet of the Amish women and my mom were comparable. It warmed my heart.

There were boys and girls playing softball that brought back many memories. The inning had ended and it was time to switch positions. Gloves flew through the air as fielders became the hitters and hitters became fielders. Again, bare feet were seen running the bases. I always thought that I could run faster with no shoes. The Amish kids must have believed the same. I saw young boys plowing and working the ground with horses. I thought of my own family as everyone had their jobs to do to make the family run smoothly. I couldn't believe that young boys could handle a team of four horses. Then I thought to myself that Mom and Dad trusted us with chores when we were young, also. It warmed my heart to see families work and play together.

The new life of the Resurrection isn't just something that happened 2000 years ago. I believe that Jesus is just as alive today. Miracles still happen. I have been blessed to see new life inside and out. Open your life and hearts to the new life of the Resurrection, the new life of the Risen Lord. Have a happy Easter season. *Fr. Mark*

Athletic Physicals for 2019-20 School Year

All students must have a physical on file before they begin practicing with any athletic team. A student needs to obtain a new physical each year. All physicals for next school year must take place after May 1, 2019 to be valid. Kalida High School will be providing FREE physicals for students entering grades 9-12 who are planning to play interscholastic sports during the 2019-2020 school year. The physical packets will be given to the students. The packet of forms must be completely filled out before you receive a physical. FREE physical night for those entering grades 9-12 is Monday, May 20, 2019 from 6:00-7:30 p.m. in the new gymnasium. If a student wears corrective lenses/contacts, please bring or wear them to the physical. Dr. Horstman and Dr. Klir will be on hand to do physicals for our students free of charge. This is the only date possible for a free physical. Please plan to attend. Note: KHS will NOT be providing free physicals to students entering grades 7 and 8 for the upcoming year. These students will have to obtain a physical from their family doctor. An alternative choice would be a FREE physical on Monday, May 6, or Monday, May 13, 2019 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. at the Orthopedic Institute of Ohio (801 Medical Drive, Suite A, Lima, OH 45804). Students going to OIO will need to bring the entire packet with them. Make sure to fill out the Consent for Pre-Participation Physical Form and the Patient Health Questionnaire in the packet in order to obtain the physical at OIO. After the physical exam is completed, OIO will send the completed packet back to the school. For those students obtaining a physical from their family doctor, the student will have to bring the completed physical packet back to the school.
