From the Desk of Fr. Mark


Hi, everyone. Yesterday was potato digging day in the garden. For me, potato growing and harvesting is more than a practical endeavor. It is a spiritual reminder for me. I do like potatoes, and we had them nearly every day when I was growing up. Even today, Fr. Elmer and I eat them often. I am reminded of Bubba from the movie "Forest Gump." You can fry them, you can French fry them, you can mash them, you can au grauten them, you can boil them, you can cheesy potato them, you can bake them, you can potato salad them. That's all I have to say about that. Unlike Bubba, I have more to say about that.

I like to dig potatoes because, like a box of chocolates, you never know what you are going to get. Potatoes come in different shapes and sizes. Sometimes a hill is full of lots of little nubbins. Those work just right for boiling. That is the favorite way of preparing them in New Zealand. And then there is the hill that produces a huge one or two. There is an oooh or awe when you dig that hill. Those are good for baked or my favorite, French fries. Then there are the hills that produce smooth average potatoes. Those are good for most everything. But my real favorite potato is the one that grew a little crazy. Sometimes they look like Mickey Mouse or other figures. As children, when we picked up potatoes, we would come up with crazy imaginative figures, which would make us laugh if our brothers and sisters could see the same figure. Those potatoes had a certain beauty about them without any sense of practicality.

Potatoes remind me of the human race in that God knows what each one is to be. Some are small or big. Some are sensible, while others are dreamers. All of them have purpose. All are good. When dad would dig the potatoes in the end of Summer, we kids had to make sure we didn't leave any behind. There were a lot of mouths to feed.

On a spiritual level, everyone has value. We live in a world that is a throw away society. If something or someone doesn't fit into our sense of value, it is thrown away or seen as less. Maybe we don't see the value of each person anymore. God has purpose for us all...even if we don't see it. Maybe we need to look harder.
