For <u>St. John's it will be on August 27</u>, at the parish feast day Mass (the feast of St. John is on Aug. 29, so we anticipating it a few days earlier). So, kindly welcome your students to these Masses as they prepare for the upcoming year!

Finally, don't forget that <u>August 15</u> is a holy day of obligation for the <u>Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u>. Our Masses will be on that day at 8:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. in Kalida, 6:00 p.m. in Continental. It's a wonderful feast that helps us consider what is preventing us from ascending to our personal best. 



What does the Eucharist represent in the life of the Church? It is the source and summit of all Christian life. In the Eucharist, the sanctifying action of God in our regard and our worship of

him reach their high point. It contains the whole spiritual good of the Church, Christ himself, our Pasch. Communion with divine life and the unity of the People of God are both expressed and effected by the Eucharist. Through the eucharistic celebration we are united already with the liturgy of heaven and we have a foretaste of eternal life (from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church).

St. Tarcisius, whose feast day is August 15, died defending the Eucharist. He would take Communion to the early Christians who were awaiting martyrdom. As he traveled the Roman road he ran into a group of pagan boys and men. He refused to show them what he had in his clothes. As the angry mob beat him Tarcisius fell shielding the Host beneath his body. The mob eventually killed him. When they rolled his body over to discover what he had been hiding they found nothing. The Host had vanished. He became the first Patron Saint of First Communion. He is also the Patron Saint of altar servers.
