Hi, everyone. School started this week and I got to have my picture taken with some first graders. The children were full of excitement at the newness of so many things. They were wide-eyed at what might be next. Smiles were on faces as the children jostled for positions for the photograph. Whatever they were expecting, it was something good. There is something good about innocence which should be protected and respected. My brother Mike and I talked about this innocence from the perspective of growing up on a farm and having brothers and sisters as playmates, friends and confidants. There was something good about being sheltered and learning the secrets of the Easter Bunny and Santa a little later in childhood. What is so good about growing up so fast?

I believe there are ways to help our children be innocent and, as adults, to appreciate the gift of innocence. Children love to play. For adults, we can foster good play. Too often games become arenas of competition and unhealthy banter. There are many activities that are just fun and not competitive. In an adult world of having to be first, sometimes it is nice to just play.

Another way to stay and appreciate innocence is to take in the simple things of life. At this time of year, there are many things in nature which are just beautiful. There are butterflies and sunsets which show the creative wonder of God. The sweetness of peaches and pears can be appreciated anew. I remember a scene in the movie, "City of Angels." In this scene, a character has to describe a pear to a person who had never experienced a pear before. Try to describe the experience of ice cream before Summer is ended. Ask a child to describe his or her favorite flavor of ice cream.

To rob a child of their innocence is a crime and a sin. Millstones were meant for people who do. That is how important children were to Jesus. As we begin a new school year and see the face of innocence right before us, maybe we need to appreciate children a bit more. I believe that Jesus not only embraced the children, but maybe their innocence and its beauty. Don Henley, of the Eagles, had a hit song called, "End of the Innocence." I believe we need to rediscover innocence. I think we have to see the world with new eyes, a new innocence. Maybe a child will lead us.

God's love is so deep and yet so simple. Take time to take in the simple message of being loved by God. We are His children. Have a simple week. *Fr. Mark*
