Bishop Thomas' Request for Prayer & Fasting

There can be no Eucharist without the priesthood, just as there can be no priesthood without the Eucharist."

In response to the priest shortage, Bishop Daniel E. Thomas is asking us to pray and fast for an increase in vocations to the priesthood.

One Hail Mary each day—Families are encouraged to add this Hail Mary to their prayer before meals, regular daily prayers or family rosary, as a way of encouraging their children to seek God's call for their life.

Fasting or penance each Friday—The fasting or penance might be foregoing a meal, abstaining from meat, avoiding snacks between meals, or some other small sacrifice.

August 8th Special Election

Bishop Thomas has offered the following information. Issue 1 will increase the threshold required for any proposed amendment to the Constitution of Ohio from a simple majority vote to at least a 60 percent majority vote in order to pass. Therefore, a "YES" vote on Issue 1 will make it more difficult to pass any future amendment to the Constitution of Ohio, including this November's ballot initiative seeking an abortion constitutional amendment that expands and enshrines abortion at the expense of protections of preborn children and women. A "no" vote on Issue 1 will maintain the current threshold, making it easier to pass an amendment to Ohio's constitution. There is no position that the Church takes on Issue 1 since it has no moral content. However, it will have an effect on potential passage of amendments to our state constitution that could threaten the sacredness of life, and parental rights, such as the proposed amendment in November.

"Yes in August" will provide that extra protection for the preborn.

Eucharistic Revival

Dear Friends, In a post-COVID world, airports are a funny thing. I've had the opportunity to travel quite a bit this summer (related to my work for the Eucharistic Revival movement) and have experienced



the frustrations of delays as well as the happiness of group gratitude for airlines going above and beyond to accommodate their patrons. One thing I've noticed, however, remains hard for me to accept: the judgmental thoughts that run through my mind: "Who didn't wipe down that countertop?" "What is wrong with that person?" "I'd never dress like that." And, I'm sorry to admit, the list could go on and on. Airports are a microcosm of scrambling humanity, in which people are trying to go anywhere but the very place they find themselves: in the airport. I think the best and the worst of us can come out when we are trying to move on from wherever we are-but the real question for you and me is, "What is really going on in my head and in my heart?"

As I reflected on the critical spirit I noticed in myself while wading the sea of fellow earth dwellers in the terminal a couple of weeks ago, I noticed that the biggest finger I was pointing was at my own self: "What is wrong with me?" Now, there is only one answer to that question-but it is the hardest answer to accept: there is nothing wrong with me. God made me good. Period. Sometimes I make bad choices; sometimes I sin. That is when I need to run to the Lord for his mercy and forgiveness-especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There is only one way to heal a broken heart, only one way to stop the cycle of judgmental thoughts and negative self-talk. It is the way of love. In this life, the most profound encounter we can have with Godwho is love-is in the sacraments, especially Reconciliation and the Eucharist. If you've been away from confession for a while, it is never too late to seek God's merciful love in that powerful sacrament. And this weekend, when you go to Mass, as the priest invites you to "lift up your heart" at the beginning of the Preface, don't be afraid to imagine that broken heart of yours and offer it completely to Jesus. He wants you to be part of his Paschal Mystery-his own Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension-which we are invited to experience at every Mass!! How marvelous.

It is through this encounter with Jesus Christ that healing and conversion are cultivated and truly all things are made new. Let's follow where our Master has gone before us and rediscover our dignity, value, and worth as beloved children of the Father! In Jesus,
