Well, I think that lately I am fulfilling dad's wishes. I have been flying by the seat of my pants ever since the coronavirus began. The Lord asked us to pick up our cross and follow Him. Sometimes we forget that His cross was a cross of love for us. Shouldn't we do the same? When we find it difficult to fly through this troubled time, remember to love God and our neighbor. We will get through this with God at our side.
