This past Wednesday was First Reconciliation at Continental. There were some scared children and parents who were scared for their children who attended the service. As I spoke with a number of parents after the service, they said that what they enjoyed most about the service was the look on their child's face after they had participated in the sacrament. When the children were all done with confessing their sins, there were smiles of relief that they had remembered all the steps to make a good Confession. They examined their conscience, confessed their sins, received a penance, made an act of contrition and received absolution. All the right steps were taken along with feeling new and forgiven. There is something really peaceful about knowing that your sins are forgiven. The faces of the children glowed with gladness as their whole selves were made like new. I wish everyone could experience that feeling of newness. I guess all of us can...we can celebrate this sacrament of forgiveness, too. It's not easy to admit our faults. It's easy to pretend that sinful things don't happen. But we don't have to pretend that the healing power of God is with us every time we go to Reconciliation. I encourage all of us to prepare the way of the Lord by going to Confession.

Just a quick news item to keep you in my loop. Today was butchering day. Each December, for the past nine years, I, along with a whole group of parishioners, butcher pigs. The pigs have been fed the scraps from school lunches and a lot of chocolate milk. Throughout the school year, tons of food gets thrown away. We get the benefit, as delicious chocolate-flavored bacon fills our plates during the winter months. Thanks to all who make this a project of conservation and conversation. Our butchering crew talks as much as we stuff sausage. A good time is had by all.
