Easter Thoughts from Fr. Mark

Happy Easter, everyone. I've been trying to get in the right spirit for Easter and it is extremely difficult this year. Fr. Elmer and I colored eggs earlier in the week. He is getting good at it. This is four years in a row that he has partaken in this activity. We usually have a couple of families from our parishes to help but this year is definitely different. There are no children, no card games or laughter (well maybe some laughter as we recall Fr. Elmer's latest joke). Easter for me has always been about recognizing the beauty and then seizing it. As a child, it was about the eggs in the front yard, but as I got older, I knew that there was beauty that God puts forth in the Savior that the world might not find.

It is Holy Thursday morning as I write this. There are now decorations in and out of church to set the stage for the beginning of the Triduum. As I look at the decorations, I want to set up a table on the church steps with a sign to say "Everyone is welcome." Jesus ate this special meal with his friends. There was no putting on of airs. Tax collectors, fishermen, saints, sinners and Jesus, Himself, were all there. And Jesus washed their feet to make sure that they got it. "It" is not about who sits where or who is first or last. It is about communion.

I believe that is why the Church celebrates with a Triduum or three holiest of days. Communion takes work and celebration. Thursday celebrates that there is a Passover from slavery to freedom, from friendship to love, from bread and wine to body and blood. Change is hard and for those in the upper room to see a friend turn into a betrayer must have been hard. It must have been hard to see someone they loved be seen as a criminal and sent to trial and be sentenced to death. There must have been guilt as the apostles were nowhere to be found. Yet Jesus called them to communion.

Friday will be a tough day. I like that a thousand people come to venerate the cross. I'm not alone in putting Him there, but am not alone in realizing what Jesus' dying on the cross did for me. There will be six people in church this year and the bishop made it clear that the celebrant was the only one to kiss the cross. I feel alone, and maybe that is a good thing to realize that He would die on the cross for just one, and to Him, it would be worth it. For that one lost sheep, Jesus would give up his life so that that one lamb would be in communion. Good Friday will be very much more reflective this year, on a very personal basis.

Saturday is a day of waiting. I think of the women who waited to come back to the tomb to anoint Jesus one more time. They had to wait till the Sabbath was over. I imagine what went through their minds. "Who will roll the stone back for us?" was a real issue. Maybe they thought they could do it together. Little did they know that there was something so much bigger than a stone to think about. Life was about to change in ways that they could have never imagined. They had given up on a dream and now the dream became alive. They wanted to share this dream, this life, with whomever would listen. A small, scared community was about to become a whole different community, as they recognized Him in the breaking of the bread and sharing heartfelt scripture. He was not in the tomb, but in communion in their lives.

Easter Sunday was always a day of life. I try to put myself at that first Easter. Would I have believed or would I have had to go to the tomb, myself? Would an empty tomb be enough or would I need to put my finger into a nail print? Blessed are those who believed and didn't see, so that they could help us who need to see to believe. It is nice to have a communion of believers to help us in our faithless times. God had faith in us that we would believe in His son. God made the first move to be in communion with us. We just need to embrace this Jesus who would show us that life will always have the victory and will always be into eternity. In these days of air hugs, this might be the Easter to embrace communion with the God who shares His son with us and all the people whom He would live, die and rise for. I'm not sure about you, but I'm ready for a group hug.

One last thought about Easter: Go fly a kite. In our family, we always got kites for Easter. If the weather was right we would go out to the pasture field and take in the wonder of flying. As a small child, I imagined being taken away to worlds I never knew, as I held onto the kite string. Easter should do that to all of us. The world needs this new kind of world. As we hold onto the Risen Lord, our world becomes new. Let Him take you there. He is Risen, as He said.
