

Rediscover the Beauty of the Mass

Fr. Nathan's Eucharistic Article 20 of 40

"Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy." (Ps 42:4)

It only took 20 weeks, but we are now ready to look at the movements of the Mass. The first question we face is: why do we begin Mass the way we do? Why do the servers carry heavy items and burning candles? Would it just be easier if everyone just went to their seats once they are vested? The simple reason is that the opening Procession sets the tone for what the Mass is all about: we as a pilgrim people moving towards heaven! Central to our faith and understanding is that we are meant for more (arts. 1-2); but yet, we are held back (art. 3). It is as if we are exiled from the life that we should be experiencing. In an effort to remind themselves of this, early Christians called themselves, in Greek, "paroiko," from which we get the word "parishioner," which means a "sojourner" ... a temporary resident in a foreign land. In other words, a person who knows that he is not home yet! When these sojourners gathered in a community, they were called a "paroikia," from which we get "parish."

The beginning of Mass then wants us to call this reality to mind. So, what happens first: from the hustle and bustle of everyday life, we first enter into a peaceful space, God's space. The contrast from the noisy outside to the quiet inside of the church reminds us immediately of God's radical plan of how He desires to pull us out of the ordinary and make us extraordinary (art. 1). This is why it's customary and very appropriate for us to begin with a private prayer, drawing to mind what we are thankful for, are in need of, and to be open to our Lord's calling. When it comes time to begin Mass, we all stand to show our readiness to follow and respond to our Lord (art. 17). We too have an opening hymn that sets the tone for that particular Mass ... emphasizing a particular way that we can process more easily to our true home.

As all this commences, the procession itself begins. While it in general symbolizes our deepest desire to move towards our Lord, it more precisely symbolizes Jesus (working through the priest [art. 12]) going to the Cross. It's the grace that Jesus merited through His sacrifice on the Cross that brings us closer to our Lord (art. 6). And it's the Mass that represents to us this sacrifice and makes those graces available (art. 7). Because of this focus on the Cross, the procession begins with a server carrying a cross, thus signifying what we are all about. At our most solemn celebrations, incense may be used, and this server (i.e. the thurifer) would precede the Cross bearer. One of the symbols of the incense is to emphasize the presence of our Lord's spirit and how He is making His grace available to us; therefore, he proceeds the Cross. After the Cross bearer are the two candle bearers, whose presence puts emphasis on the centrality of the Cross. Next is the deacon, who carries the Book of the Gospels ... the books that share our Lord's saving plan for us that culminated in the Cross. Finally, there is the priest, the one who stands for us before our Lord, but also stands for Jesus working in our midst.

Upon approaching the sanctuary, reverence is given to the altar and tabernacle. For those carrying anything they make a bow of the head, while the rest make a genuflection. Before the liturgical changes of Vatican II, there

were actually prayers said (i.e. psalm 42) at the foot of the altar to emphasize the importance of what was to take place in the sanctuary. In fact, the sanctuary is typically elevated by a number of steps, reminding us of Jesus' ascent to Mount Calvary. When the priest and deacon enter the sanctuary, they kiss the altar. This may seem like an odd gesture, but it's a symbol of deep reverence for what has and will take place there: the representation of Jesus' sacrifice. It calls to mind the Biblical scene of the sinful woman who bathed Jesus' feet with tears and kissed them (Lk 7:38). So too as we begin Mass, we are mindful of our shortcomings, how essential our Lord is in making a difference in our lives, and how we too should be moved with that same charity. Fr. Nathan


