Through the years, I have come to the conclusion that having fun was more important than beating someone. To look through the eyes of having to beat someone may close my eyes to the beauty of a sport or a person. Today I cheer for good plays, sportsmanship and for teams that play the game right.

From a spiritual point of view, if we always look at life through the eyes of beating sin, we may close our eyes to the blessings of each day. We might become like my sister-inlaw and just drop out of the game rather than enjoy God's gifts. We do live in a fallen world, but we also live in a world blessed by God. If we only see the sin of abortion, we may miss the amazing miracle of a child in the womb or the miracle of a birth of a child or the hope and love of God as that child grows. If we see the sinfulness within our Church, we will miss the blessings of the celebrations of sacraments and the coming to the table as God's people to share in the presence of our Lord. If we give more attention to sin, we truly miss the wonder of our faith that sin has been conquered by the love of God. If love makes all things possible, because God is love, we need to put the fun before the competition. We need to put goodness of God first before seeing the bad first, and that is a slam dunk.

I will cheer for both teams tonight as I did last Friday night, as I cheered for both Continental and Kalida. May both teams be winners. That can only happen when the joy of the game comes before the competition of the game. May we always see the joy of the gospel by living the love of the gospel.
