

From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. I have two main thoughts for today and they can be summed up in an old John Denver song: "Thank God I'm a Country Boy." With a complicated world around me, I still go back to simple roots. "Got me a fine wife, got an old fiddle and cakes on the griddle" and other simple things as the song goes, make me thank God. Two current events make me wonder as a simple person, as a simple person who loves God.

The first event was the question of a valid Baptism in the Church. The question of the right words of "we" or "I" as someone is ceremonially Baptized came into question and what that means for the living out of one's Catholic faith. Thank God I'm a Country Boy. I will let theologians ponder lofty questions and all the implications of a mysterious Trinity and how the divine and human can come together in the person of Jesus. I do know that God first loves us and shows us that love in many varied ways. God shows us that love, in the person of Jesus who showed us to love God and our neighbor, should be the simplest of laws, but not always easy to achieve. God will help us live this reality with gifts of the Holy Spirit. To keep it simple: that God first loves us and that His love is enough for me. Even prior to Baptism, God loves us. Even prior to our birth, God loves us. Even prior to our conception, God loves us. And because of that love, we are made to love with or without Baptism. Who would believe that we could make love so complicated?

The second event that made me think of simplicity is the situation in the Ukraine. As I am writing this, my heart hurts. I visited the Ukraine in 1979 and wonder if any of the children and people I met could be some of the people involved in the conflict. Many times the innocent are hurt in conflicts. Last Sunday the Lord asked us to love our enemies. Our hearts should hurt when anyone is hurt, innocent or not. This conflict brings big questions which are too big for simple people to answer. But we still have to live in this complexity. To live simply and walk with God is probably the best answer I can give when people ask what our response should be to this crisis. Instead of worrying about things we cannot control, put into action the love I can control. To take time to love our families around us changes the world we live in. It may not seem like an earth shattering answer, but the love of God shattered the power of sin and death. It is our faith. It is our hope. It is love that makes the difficult simple.

I do thank God because I am a country boy with all the simple things that go with it. Most of all, I thank God because He has made me a child of God, because He loves me.
