


From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. I'm sitting in my office on a cold day. I've seen snow days and fog days when school is closed. Today is a cold day and school is closed, so I have a little extra time to think and reflect on what a cold day was when I was younger.

For my mom, a cold day had to be when the temperature was below zero. On those days, mom would make oatmeal. It was the only time throughout the year that we got a hot meal for breakfast (and I didn't like oatmeal those days). There were still farm chores to do and the oatmeal was one way to get through till dinner. It was a cold day on the farm when you broke out the whiskey. Having a dairy farm, we always had calves born in the middle of cold snaps. Sometimes, after taking the calves from their mothers, the baby calves might need a little extra nourishment and warmth to get them through the coldest days. Along with their milk replacement, which we would feed the calves twice a day, the weakest calves would receive two eggs and a shot of whiskey (dad's orders). A bottle of whiskey would usually last a couple of years in our family. On a cold day on the farm, I always had to visit the farrowing house. This was where the baby pigs were born. This was my favorite place to visit on a really cold day. This building had heat, at least heat bulbs, which would keep the little pigs warm as they bundled together after they were born. On our farm, it seemed like pigs were always born on the coldest days. As a boy, I hoped that more than one sow would have its piglets on a cold day. That way I could stay and make sure the birthing pigs would make their way from the warmth of 102 degrees of a mother through the below zero temperatures to the heat lamps. Sometimes the shock of the cold would be a lot for a piglet and it lay lifeless. But with a little TLC and warmth, ears would begin to flutter and tail to wag. If there were a number of sows having pigs, I could stay there for hours watching life. If the heat lamp experience failed on the coldest of days, I would load up a bushel basket full of pigs and run them to the house and get the most warmth that I could give them.

I grew up knowing ,that on the coldest days, a mother would make sure her children would receive a little extra warmth. I grew up knowing that, on the coldest days, a father would make sure that the weakest would have the most consideration and be given all that he could do for the one who needed it most, even if it was a calf. I grew up knowing that, on the coldest days, the cold would not stop life from not knowing warmth. You did everything you could to shut the cold out so that life would win.

And now I'm grown up and it's a cold day. A neighboring state says it is legally fine to deny life to an emerging child if those are the wishes of the mother. I try to get my mind around this, but it is like walking into a minus wind chill – it takes your breath away and you wonder if you can catch the next breath. I know that I need to retreat to the place of real warmth, home in the Lord. It's really a cold day, but I believe in something stronger than cold.


