From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. When it comes to technology, I am at the least, poor. I am so bad that I had to look up "technology" in a paperback dictionary so that I could spell technology. I grew up in an age of milking cows by hand, collecting eggs from underneath an unsuspecting hen and speaking to a number of neighbors on the party line when I really wanted to call someone out for a date (no wonder I am a priest). When it comes to technology, I am pretty useless. I have updated some aspects of my technological life, but for big questions, I turn to others.

Our parishes have had to keep up with the new technology in that Mass and different services are now shared with parishioners and others around the world through cable television, Facebook and YouTube. When covid hit our parishes used technology to keep in touch. When Mass was limited to the priest and perhaps a musician, technology kept us connected spiritually. I have heard from people around the country and internationally who have "watched" Mass televised from Kalida and Continental. Some have even sent checks to say thank you for keeping them connected with the Lord. And now both parishes are trying to keep up from a technology point of view by improving our camera at St. John's and our sound system at St. Michael's. Hopefully, our worship of the Lord in the pews becomes better and more rich at the same time.

Because some people got used to "attending" Mass at home responses might not be as rich. I really do want the Lord to be with you. It is nice to hear that you want the Lord to be with me, also. There is real power when we worship the Lord together. We can feel that we are God's family. We feel each other's support, care and love. We put our faith into action by responding at Mass. Singing at Mass is a good way to praise the Lord, also. At home it was hard to sing along, but now that we are back, it is time to make a joyful song to the Lord. Don't be afraid to sing. My mom could not sing, but she gave it her all in church. I think it made the people around her sing louder and better. God is so good to us. Let us give it our all when it comes to singing. Singing is not just for our choirs (although we have good ones). Let us sing when we come to worship Him.

Through technology many people observed Mass from an easy chair, under blankets, with coffee in hand and many other comfortable ways of observing. Worship is meant to be a participation activity while the covid age has made worship more of a observation activity. People could catch up with Mass through the pause button or skip the homily and come back for communion. People would turn off Mass when the priest would say the Mass is ended and not stay for the ending song. And now we come back to the reality of live worship. Pews are not as comfortable as easy recliners, coffee is not ready during the offertory, and snacks are not provided for children. But to worship together as a family is great. To see and greet our neighbors and members of the Body of Christ is powerful. To let them know we are praying for them brings peace and unity. To see the young people and children gives us hope that the Body of Christ is growing. To feel the faith alive through our responses and singing brings a certain warmth that we share a common love for the Lord. To receive the Lord in Communion is life giving, not only to ourselves, but as a whole Body of Christ.

When we say "Amen" to the Lord, we say Amen with people around us in Kalida and Continental and the world for whom He would live and die for. Technology keeps us in touch in one way. Faith hope and love keep us in touch in the old-fashioned way.

I'd like to say a big thanks to everyone who has kept us connected through technology. I invite everyone to stay connected by coming to our worship services and participating with all your hearts. God is so good to us. Let us praise Him together with all that we are.


Virtue of the Week is Circumspection
