From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone, I'm getting ready for a couple of days off. I will be heading to Hocking Hills to do some walking and enjoying God's good earth. I leave on Thursday and will be back on Saturday night. I'd like to give you a rundown of my idea of Winter camping. First, you have to have the right foods. I think that while I'm on vacation, my body should be on vacation. Foods include inside foods and outside foods. Outside foods include a good hamburger on the grill, followed by a good brat. At night, marshmallows need to be roasted...not burnt. I need all the prayers I can get. I can't tell you how many times I pray for someone and then I encounter them at church or out and about. 


