Hi, everyone. I survived another Mission Trip. Survive is not the right word, as I came back a couple of pounds heavier and full of great stories. There has been lots to think and pray over. A couple of images stick out for me. One is the coming together of our 26 missionaries. We had just eaten at a Mexican restaurant and were standing outside in the parking lot. There was such a sense of unity and peace amongst the group of people who had only been together for a few days. We prayed and played and worked together for a common purpose. As I looked over our small group, I felt a sense of goodness which gave me great peace.

The other image that stavs with me is of the youngest girl in the family. She is a child of 8 years. Her name is Paisley. As we worked on her house, she would lend a little hand and make childlike comments. She asked if she could start moving in on the first day. The next day a little dinosaur was found on the kitchen shelf. She asked, when the kitchen cabinets were installed, if she could **BATHROOM BEFORE BATHROOM AFTER** bring over a small bag of Doritos. It was nice to see her want a home and wish beyond today. She asked for addresses so that she could be a pen pal with girls in our group. She really liked the teenagers on our trip. I'm not sure what the future holds for this family of five, but at least for Paisley, she is ready to go forward. For my brother, he was glad to go and meet wonderful people. He enjoyed the work and enjoyed losing a couple of pounds and would definitely go again, but came away a little angry. As we talked, he figured out that he was angry at poverty. Poverty takes away human dignity on different levels. The decisions one makes are so affected by ones' surroundings.

My brother was concerned about how the three children in the household would grow up in the midst of such poverty. Decisions about future jobs, school and human interaction are so affected by the poverty which dictates so much of their past and present. It is hard not to do more or wish and pray for more. We barely made a dent in a wall of poverty, but tried to do our part in giving a home to the homeless. Poverty challenges faith, hope and love. I know that God is with us in our challenges and I know who wins. I'd like to thank all those who supported us on this mission trip. There were those who gave anonymous gifts. There were those who prayed especially for this past week's work. Kind words go a long way. Thanks to everyone who made this year's trip a mission of God's love. I could go on and on with stories, but will spare you this week. It is good to be back and see all of you. May there be no poverty of God's love. Fr. Mark
