Hi, everyone. I hope you all have a great week, especially all dads on Father's Day weekend. As I have been thinking about what stories to tell about my dad in this article, so many come to mind. I'd like to honor my dad by telling some of my favorite "dad" stories.

My dad, Herman, was pretty meek and mild. If you ever did anything which would get you in trouble, you always wanted dad to find out before mom. Mom's discipline was pretty much like a movie, "Fast and Furious." Dad's style was more thought out and cerebral. There were no harsh words or cuss words that came from dad's mouth. With that as background, here is a story of my dad playing cards with grandsons. Dad was taking a beating and the grandsons were giving him a hard time. The game was almost over when dad got a series of unbelievable cards. Hand after hand the comeback was on. With one final hand, the comeback was complete. Dad stood up at the table, looked right into the eyes of his ornery grandsons and said, in an edited way, "Put that in your pipe and smoke it. That's how us old people get the job done." He smiled and sat down. The grandsons laughed and still do today.

A second story comes from my dad being in the seminary. Dad had some health issues and really loved the seminary. He enjoyed learning, as he read a lot. He was voted the most likely to become a priest by his class. As his seminary studies continued, the directors thought, because of his health issues, that he should not become a priest. They told him to pick a profession that was not so strenuous as a priest. He just wasn't healthy enough to be a priest. So he got married, had 17 children and ran a farm. I always figured that is why he had 17 children...to show his directors that he wasn't that unhealthy. He handled it well and trusted that the Lord had good plans for him. After the loss of two children and numbers of losses of crops and livestock, dad's attitude remained strong of trusting the Lord. Dad always said that he could handle any problem as long as it was outside the house. Dad's house included his love of God, mom and us kids. Dad's love of God and trusting in His ways to do what is right has always stuck with me.

There are many stories of dad fishing in Canada, farming with horses and enjoying a game of cards with whomever would play with him. He lived till he was 91. I guess he wasn't that unhealthy. His sister, Sally, is still going strong at 101. We might not know exactly what God has planned for us, but dad showed me that to trust Him is the best plan of all.






