Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. One more week to go and I'm trying to think of something profound that I want to say. That is hard for me because most of what I want to say is in my actions. I just got back from a four-day gathering with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. There were a number of talks and voting for new leadership, but not much profound action came forth in fancy ballrooms in Indianapolis. Faith is just faith until it is really put into action. So, my profound word that comes to mind is to "jump."

I remember so many times on the farm when jumping was the right thing to do. As kids we played in the barn and jumped into piles of straw from the mow. I look at that activity now and just smile, but to think of the first time I had to jump from the safety of a secure haystack into the uncertainty of loose straw, I was scared. There were lots of excuses of why I shouldn't jump. Maybe a cat was hiding in the loose straw. Maybe a brother left a pitchfork in the loose mound. After enough coaching and teasing and surety that everything would be alright, I made the leap which led to more leaping and more joy. On the farm I leapt from trees, off tractor seats, into creeks, onto cows and sows' backs to ride, off the porch roof to escape from older siblings and the list could go on and on. I learned how important it is to jump.

When it comes to Church, I learned how important it is to jump, also. I grew up in the Vatican II era when things in religious circles were new. There were new things that looked scary to some people: just like I was scared to jump from the stack of hay bales when I was on the farm. There were new gestures, new language, new ways to pray and the list could go on and on. Even with the assurance that it was alright, it was hard to make that jump. When I had to answer the call to religious life, I had to jump from the security of farming to a whole new lifestyle. I knew that to truly be happy I would have to take a leap of faith. In many pastoral settings, especially when it comes to health and difficult questions, I had to turn to a God whom I could not see. Jesus said it would be alright, but I still had to trust enough to make that leap. In our parishes there have been many times when we had to make a leap into the unknown. It is a leap to forgive someone and not know if they will forgive us back. There is the welcoming of a brother or sister in the church when yesterday they were just a stranger.

This weekend is the feast of the Body and Blood of our Lord. Now there is a leap of faith. To see and know that the Lord is present in the appearance of bread and wine is faith in action. To trust the Lord's words that, "This is my Body, and This is my Blood " is truly a leap. The Lord trusts us to say yes, and we trust the Lord that His words are true. As a member of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, I miss the reception of the Precious Blood from the cup for our family. I know how precious of a gift it is to receive the Lord through the Precious Blood. One day we will be able to participate through the chalice again. But until then, let us truly receive the Lord in His fullness. He came to give Himself to us, let us receive Him fully.

Have we jumped into our faith? Have we jumped into the arms of our Lord? Are we ready to make a leap of faith which will lead to true happiness? Our faith is sometimes scary. I encourage you to jump.

It will be hard to jump into my new assignment. I do it with faith from the security of parishes who have great faith. Have a great week.
