From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone.

I just got off the phone with people from Celina and Dayton. The tornadoes there were devastating on all kinds of levels. Many lost roofs, prized possessions and some heart. When I asked what we could do in Kalida and Continental, the response was: just pray for us. Many have contributed water, toiletries and food supplies. Those things will get sorted out, and they are very much needed, but many people are now trying to sort through their lives and priorities. I saw the path of destruction vesterday as I drove through Dayton. Lying on the ground were people's possessions, strewn through neighborhoods. It is one thing to sort through a neighborhood to find some "thing," but quite another to sort through destruction to find your life. It is quite amazing, with all the destruction, that only one life was lost. But that is one too many and adds so much to the level of loss. Please remember in your prayers all those affected by these storms.

We have had a number of "storms" in our parishes lately. We have had deaths and illnesses that have brought hurt to families and individuals. It is so good that so many reach out to literally lend a helping hand. It is so good that so many also come together to pray when the storms of our lives can devastate us. Does it make a difference when we light a candle in church for someone or attend a funeral of a neighbor? Just ask those families who are in the midst of the storm. One can probably get through the storm by ones self, but it means so much to be supported in prayer by a community. I am so proud of our communities who do so much AND pray. Our world is becoming more and more individualistic. It is so important to be in a community so that help and prayers are readily available. Does coming together as a Church make a difference? Yes, on so many levels. To know that God and the people of God stand firm in the storms of life can mean the world to a person whose world is falling apart.

Not everything in my world is devastating. Last weekend my niece got married. We had fun. It took me till Tuesday to recover from all the fun and dancing. I believe it is just as important to gather in those times, too. Nieces and nephews came from different states to celebrate and pray for Liz and Rob. Did it make a difference to the bride and groom? Just ask them. When I did, they said how important it was to them to see their family come together and support, celebrate and pray for them. We have had some nice weddings, baptisms and graduation celebrations in church. Let these families and individuals know that they are being prayed for. It will put a smile on their faces.

Church and prayer is important. It is a joy to see that priority in families' lives every day and, especially, every Sunday. *Fr. Mark*

Vacation Bible School is July 15-18


Vacation Bible School **<u>supplies</u>** needed are: napkins, wet ones, gold fish (not individually packed), and shoe boxes.
