St. George Deanery (Putnam County) Youth Gathering Held at St. Michael's Last Sunday

This group of 6-7-8 graders joined with almost 100 youth from around the St. George Deanery this past Sunday afternoon for their Junior High Gathering. The focus of the day was the Eucharist. They traveled between sessions learning about Eucharistic Miracles, Adoration and parts of the Mass. Thank you to all the Youth Ministers from Leipsic, Fort Jennings and Miller City/New Cleveland, the adults who helped with the meal and High School helpers (from Kalida and Miller City) who made the day a success.

Fr. Nathan's Eucharistic Article 24 of 40

"A young man named Eutychus who was sitting on the window sill was sinking into a deep sleep as Paul talked on and on. Once overcome by sleep, he fell down from the third story and when he was picked up, he was dead."

(Acts 20:9)

As we can see from scripture, homilies can be deadly. We have all set through our fair share of dreadful homilies, and perhaps for some of us, it's a deterrent for wanting to go to Mass. So, what's the point? At its essence, a homily is supposed to show how the readings are relevant to our lives right now and also to prepare us to encounter our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. The word homily is Greek for "explanation." It was an ancient Jewish custom in the synagogues, that after the Bible readings there was an explanation of the sacred text. In fact, Jesus took advantage of such instances (e.g. Mk 1:21 and Lk 4:16). As seen from Acts, Paul himself continued the practice, as well as the entire early Church. St. Timothy said "until I arrive attend to the reading, preaching and teaching. Do not neglect the gift you have, which was conferred on you through the prophetic word with the imposition of hands" (1 Tim 4:13-14). As you can see from Timothy, he links the homily with the ordained. This doesn't mean the ordained are smarter or more gifted in public speaking; rather, it points to the fact that just as Jesus works through the cleric at the altar, so too does our Lord work through the cleric at the ambo. In other words, just as the cleric stands in the person of Christ at the altar, so too is that the case at the ambo.

But why are homilies so bad? I think it's important to realize that by its nature, a homily is no easy task. We say the homily is to show how the readings are "relevant to our lives," but let's face it: we are all very different. Different ages, different experiences, different obligations, different headaches and stresses, different personal struggles, different family background, ect. Thus, on any given weekend, what is relevant to one person may not be to another. Another key difficulty, that unlike in some protestant "mega churches," the homily is not the main point of the Mass. It is not even of secondary or tertiary importance (in my opinion), because for us Catholics, the main point is to have the Sacrifice of the Cross represented to us, so that we can have the graces (merited on the Cross) applied to our lives, and consequently then in a better position (emotionally-spiritually-mentally) to take on the upcoming week. That is the main point, the "cake" itself and the homily is simply "icing" on top. This reality has several implications. First, if we experience a "bad" homily, it is impossible for that to objectively ruin a Mass. Subjectively we may be disappointed, but objectively we still have the graces of the Cross represented to us in a sacramental way, and that's what it is all about. Secondly, because this is our main focus at the Mass, it also affects our expectations/training of seminarians. Seminarians have some courses and training with homiletics; however, it's not the central concern of their formation. First and foremost is forming a man who loves our Lord, who can be prayerful and reverent at the altar, and who is authentic in sharing the faith. With saying this, it's not an outright excuse for bad homilies. All clerics

should always strive to improve in how they present the faith. Nonetheless, it's not always someone's gift and talent.

So what can be done? First, I think it's always important to pray for our clerics that they don't lose their zeal for preaching. Secondly, I think we can pray for ourselves that we can overlook another person's human shortcomings. Thirdly, if we actively listen to the reading of the Scriptures and ask "how does this apply to me," it will put us in a more open disposition to hear the homily. In turn, this will put us in a better position to receive an insight and be more aware of how we want the graces of the Cross to be applied to our life that week.
