From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone.

I hope everyone's Lent is off to a good start. I've asked the children if they are doing anything for Lent and they all put their hands up. There are times I wonder if our world treats Easter like it does Christmas and make it a holiday for children. Lent is a season in which we all need to participate as we live and say in many ways that we need a Redeemer and celebrate at Easter that it is Jesus. So what are all you adults doing for Lent this year? As for me, I am not going to say what I am doing but my heart is torn by what is going on in the Ukraine. Pray with me for the whole situation as we pray for leaders, soldiers and families.

This coming Saturday at the 4:30 Mass in Kalida we will celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation. Students from St. Michael's and St. John's will gather for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Our young people have been in my prayers especially over these past weeks. They have shown growth in their faith and love for their God. They have been attending Mass and showing their faith in works of mercy. One of my favorite parts of Confirmation preparation is I get to see our young people up front and personal. I get to ask them questions and try to help them on their faith journeys. This year, especially at St. Michael's, I asked the candidates to treat the interviews like a job interview. For some I had them shake my hand, introduce themselves and say why they wanted this job of being a Christian. Since they were becoming "adults" in the Church, it was time to get to work. I asked if they had any work experience (works of mercy), job references (sponsor), anyone they looked up to in the workplace (their saint) and could they be depended upon to show up on time (having their bulletins signed). I asked if they knew the boss (God) and that there are many branch offices and if they were ready to work while on the road. We talked about benefits programs both while they worked (the Kingdom of God is here) and when they retired (Heaven). They really don't get any vacations but if you like your work it is not really work. I let the students know that when I got Confirmed that the bishop slapped me on the cheek to remind me that the work of being a Christian would not always be easy. Many of the students remarked that some of the difficult work that they would encounter would be to stand up for their faith. They are recognizing that the world is not always as Christian as we would like it to be. They knew that part of their response to being a Christian would be to be counter cultural. They knew that going to church was important in keeping strong in their faith. I told them that talking to the boss often would get them brownie points.

We had a good time in the interviews, at least I did. I wondered if adults would have to interview for the job of being Christian if there would be many applicants. At the end of the student interviews I usually shook their hand and said that they were hired. If Jesus would be doing the interview would I get the job. It was fun to do the interviews and hear the young people express their faith. As adults do we express our faith in words and actions as well as we should?

Have a great week, everyone. Please pray for the situation in the Ukraine and pray for our Confirmation candidates.
