What Does Confirmation Actually Do?

This weekend the 8th graders in Kalida received the sacrament of Confirmation! This is probably the most misunderstood sacrament, because often the focus is on the secondary aspects of it (e.g. becoming an adult in the church, making our faith our own, etc.). The essential question is this: what does it actually do? How am I different with Confirmation? Well, at the core of this sacrament, our Lord is permanently sharing His grace to help us better witness to our faith for others. The sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, and Communion all aim at strengthening our relationship with our Lord; but, with Confirmation, the aim is to help share this faith in an effective way to others ... trying to bring them to our Lord and change their lives. Of course before Confirmation we all have natural gifts and talents, and so we can witness to our faith. However, Confirmation builds on those gifts and talents we have so that we can do it better! What greater gift can we share with a person than the experience of God Himself? Confirmation gives us the tools (wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, reverence); the next step is that we have to use them. That only happens through prayerful preparation. Join me in praying for our 8th graders who received this life-changing sacrament, that they may respond to the graces and so bring Christ to others more effectively.

Also remember this Sunday afternoon in St. Michael's at 3:00 p.m., the Bishop is offering the Eucharistic Revival prayer service. As part of the national effort of all bishops to promote a great devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, Bishop Thomas has been offering these services throughout the diocese at certain churches...St. Michael's was chosen for our area. The service will consist of music, reflections from the Bishop, adoration, and an opportunity for Confession. This will prove to be a very helpful means to enter deeper into Fr. Nathan Lent!
