

From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. I hope your week was a good one. This past week I did a lot of reflecting on gluttony. It was the wrong week to focus on that deadly sin. With two weddings over the weekend and three baptisms, I did not need reminded of gluttony, as there was food around every corner. I found out how much the German culture centers on food. I did not overeat, but my feet were a little sore from dancing...is that a deadly sin?

I do have to say a word or two about my niece's wedding. IT WAS GREAT! The best part for me was the coming together of family and all of the bride and groom's friends. My niece is a track star and invited were people from Spain, England, Africa, African Americans, Hungarian Americans and many nationalities. People came together in little Carthagena church (about the size of the old Cuba church) to pray together for the newly married couple. As a boy, there were curfews for people of color in Mercer County. And within my lifetime and within my home church, people of all colors came together. Carthagena was set up as a place where freed slaves could come and have a home. Last weekend, people of all races came together and freely worshipped and danced all night. It made me smile all week as I pictured all God's people coming together and celebrating God calling together two people to the sacrament of Marriage. It was a little glimpse of heaven.

Alright, enough about the wedding. Back to the next deadly sin: sloth. Sloth can be defined as indifference or inaction to God's call. I always think of sloth in terms of a scriptural reference from the book of Revelation of being lukewarm; neither hot nor cold. And the Lord spews these people out of His mouth. We are called to be on fire for the Lord. But for some reason we put off. "I'll get to it later" or "work at God's things second" are the attitudes that come out. How many times do we need to be told twice or more before we take action? How many times do we wait until someone else makes the first move? Sloth is deadly because sometimes no move is made at all. A kind word to stop gossip is never uttered. A meal to a neighbor is never made. The hungry are not fed. The imprisoned are never visited. The naked are not clothed because of sloth. Our Confirmation students are asked to do a service project to remind them of Jesus' attitude to love our neighbor. Perhaps we all need a reminder to have the flames of Pentecost, of the Holy Spirit, to bring us to action.

To be a Christian calls us to action and many times to hard action. We are called to carry crosses. Sloth sometimes slows down and makes love die. It can be deadly. I am glad that someone stood up to racism so that we could have a GREAT wedding last weekend. Do we put our faith into action or has sloth taken over?
