Fr. Nathan's Eucharistic Article 32 of 40

"For as often as your eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord" (1 Cor 11:26)

Last week we explored the first four elements of the Eucharistic Prayer (i.e. Thanksgiving, Acclamation, Epiclesis, and Consecration). Now we will look at the final four.

Anamnesis: After we sing the "Mystery of Faith" prayer, the priest then transitions into this prayer which calls to mind our Lord's passion, resurrection, and ascension into heaven. The word "anamnesis" is Greek, and it means "to call to mind." It is include in this part of the Eucharistic prayer to remind all of us that we are acting in obeyance to our Lord's command. Furthermore, we acknowledge the Eucharistic elements as a sacrament of our Lord's sacrifice. For example, in the Roman Canon it states:

> "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the blessed Passion ... we, your servants and your holy people, offer to your glorious majesty ... the holy bread of eternal life and the Chalice of everlasting salvation"

Oblation: In the offertory prayer, the priest asks our Lord to accept the bread and wine. Now that they are consecrated, we now offer Christ Himself to the Father. The intention is that the faithful not only offer the Victim but also learn to offer themselves and so as to form a more complete union with the Father and each other. In the Roman Canon, the prayer states:

> "In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God: command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty, so that all of us, who though this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son, may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing"

Intercessions: Since Jesus entire sacrifice itself is an intercession (i.e. an action done on our behalf, cf. arts 5 and 6) and the Mass represents this sacrifice to us, it is very fitting that intercessions are included in the Eucharistic Prayers. These intercessions make it clear that we celebrate Mass not just for ourselves, but for all the members of the church: living and dead. There are three basic clauses in the Intercessions. First is a prayer for the entire Church in the world who is shepherded by the Pope and locally by our bishop. Secondly, is a prayer for all the deceased members of the Church, that they may be welcomed into heaven. Thirdly, we seek the intercession of the saints so that we may enjoy eternal life with them.

Final Doxology: The word "Doxology" is a Greek word, meaning "to give glory." Thus, we end the Eucharistic Prayer by giving our Lord glory. In this final prayer, the priest lifts up the chalice and host, and says:

"Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever."

This prayer is taken from St. Paul (Rom 11:36) and is found in the earliest forms of the Eucharistic prayers. It succinctly summarizes what has just taken place. "Through him," it is only through Jesus' mediation that we have access to the Father: "No one can come to the Father except through me" (Jn 14:6). "With him," because "without me you can do nothing" (Jn 15:5). It reminds us of how dependent we are on our Lord (cf. art. 8). "In him," because as Jesus said "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him" (Jn 15:5). Finally, we conclude the Eucharistic Prayer with a profound "Amen" (cf. art. 22). **Fr. Nathan**
