From the Desk of Fr. Mark

It was a little slice of heaven to see colored leaves glide down to earth in descending circles. Three squirrels came close enough for me to invite one over for dinner with Fr. Elmer. He didn't accept. Birds of all colors and sizes filled my viewing area. Their red and bronze colors matched the leaves which floated to the earth. Woodpeckers broke the silence of the quiet Fall scene with repeated search for hidden insects. A loud rustling of leaves made me believe a large buck was about to burst into view.
