From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. Yesterday was a different kind of day for me, as I had many thoughts of my dad. It was the anniversary of his death (16 years) and the readings were about being thankful to God. I decided to get ready for Thanksgiving and honor my dad at the same time. I thought about things to be thankful for regarding my dad, past, present and to come.

The past was easy, as dad had a huge influence in my life. He taught me about God. Dad, in his later years, went to Mass every day. His local church of Carthagena meant so much to him. He and mom purchased the tabernacle, even though money was tight. He was on the parish council. As a farmer, he prayed for crops and livestock. He prayed out loud sometimes and let us kids hear him. He prayed the rosary with the family in October and May and had the rosary around his bedpost so that he and mom could pray before going to sleep. For dad, God wasn't someone who was found only in a ritual, but was alive in every way. Dad was in the seminary and was asked to leave because of health reasons. 17 children later and much physical work on a farm proved his seminary directors wrong. Dad always kept up with all the changes in the Church and welcomed them. One of his favorite sayings was that the institutional Church doesn't need salvation. People do. Taking care of real people was very important to dad. Thanks to God who gave me a dad who loved God and the Church, which includes all the people of the world.

Dad was with me when I had my first accident. I still recall how scared I was when I backed into a car in a parking lot. Dad assured me that accidents happen and that he would take care of the damage with the owner. He let me know that I had to be more careful. But I believe that mercy was really shown me that day and I remember mercy often. For all the lessons of life, thank you God for my dad.

There are times when I think of dad in the present. With All Saints Day just past, I consider my dad (and mom) saints. I ask them to pray with me many times. From dad, I ask him to pray to God for wisdom. Dad was very smart and very wise. In many of the decisions of parish life, I ask for wisdom from God. I think of my dad in the present as I think of patience. I think of how patient my dad had to be with all those years of teenage daughters (it was never us boys who got on dad's nerves, lol). When I need patience, I think of dad. I thank God for all the ways dad's influence touches my life today.

When I think of dad in the future, I always think of mom and dad together. God's promise of eternal life is what dad believed in and lived for. I can't wait to see dad and mom together again in the next life. I thank God for His promises that I believe dad shares in today and forever.




