Thoughts from Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. It is nice to be back after days and days of quarantine. I feel pretty good, except a little weak. I haven't got my taste back, but I was never known as a person with good taste. Because of a lack of taste, I haven't felt like eating for about two weeks. Luckily, I had my winter reserve below my belt and should be good for a while. The time away from work and people gave me a chance to reflect and pray. I took walks throughout the day as the weather was perfect for isolation. I walked in different woods every day. I found out that I'm not very good at sneaking up on deer, but found deer every day. Birds of all varieties made my day with their colors and songs. Taking time to watch leaves fall is a luxury that I never take advantage of when I am feeling well. To watch an individual leaf float in circles till it reaches the ground makes me feel like I am in the palm of God's hand. If God can arrange nature to allow leaves to float in such a beautiful pattern, how much more does the Lord fashion this world for all of us? There are times we just have to let God be the author of life rather than to try to order God's handiwork. My favorite image from these days of quarantine and being in a woods is that of an owl I encountered a few days ago. As I began my walk, a huge great horned owl glided past me. Owls are silent fliers and at first it startled me and then amazed me. As I walked through the woods, it seemed like I tripped on many down branches or got scratched by brambles which would appear out of nowhere. Yet this big agile owl made circles through the woods like there was nothing in its path. I was amazed at this bird's eyesight at how it could see right in front of it to avoid a down branch and yet far ahead to know its next turn to keep it soaring through the brambles. The owl seemed to have a perfect balance of knowing the present and the future, to see right in front of it and yet knowing where it wanted to sail. If our spiritual journeys could be that balanced, it would be great.

And I missed everyone on a daily level and on a spiritual level. Mass has always meant so much to me and not praying with people was hard on me. I "went" to church on a media level, but it just wasn't like praying together on a real level. There is power when two or more gather in His name. I missed that way of being fed spiritually. I missed being fed with the Eucharist. God is truly present and I am really fed and watered by God. It was so nice to celebrate Mass this morning with our seventh graders and parishioners. I think I smiled all through Mass. It is good to be back.

My brother said that I should not overdue it. I will try. I just enjoy living God's life with the people of Continental and Kalida. May God bless all of you and know you were missed and prayed for.
