# Fr. Nathan's Eucharistic Article 8 of 40

#### "Do This in Remembrance of Me"

Last week in article 7, we saw how the Sacrifice of the Cross is not simply remembered during a Mass; rather, every Mass represents THE Sacrifice of the Cross and thus makes available the treasury of grace won by Christ. So, it may be wondered if that is the case, why do we have multiple Masses? Wouldn't my attendance at just one Mass be sufficient? Well, one Mass would be sufficient if we never sinned again. However, the more and more we reflect on our lives we realize we need all the help we can get! For this reason, Jesus Himself tells us to "do this in memory of me" (LK 22:19). St. Paul quotes Jesus as expecting this to be repeated: "for as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup" (1 COR 11:26). Again, this is not to make us feel bad about ourselves; but rather, to give the clearest chance to be in communion with our Lord.

When speaking of the Eucharist and the Mass, St. Thomas Aguinas called it "food for the journey." It's the idea that it provides the spiritual sustenance for our soul ... and there is so much weighing our soul down in this fallen world. Frankly, the idea actually goes back to Jesus who connects the sacrament of the Mass with the Manna in the desert as the Israelites traveled to the Promised Land. In the Exodus story, the Israelites complained about taking this journey to the Promised Land, to the point that they wanted to return back to slavery in Egypt (this may sound strange, but to be honest, how many of us fall back into the same bad habits even though we know they are not in our best interest!) The Lord intervenes by sending the sustenance they need: "bread from Heaven" called Manna (EX 16:4). "Manna" literally in Hebrew means "what is it," which is appropriate because it's not something we can come up with ... it's from God Himself. On a side note, Moses even instructed the Israelites to "Eat it today, for today is the Sabbath of the Lord" (EX 16:25). Anyways, Jesus says that He is the definitive Manna, the real bread that will provide them the sustenance they need to get to the real Promised Land (i.e. the purpose of what they were made for, both in this life and the life to come). Jesus says "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will **never thirst**" (JN 6:35). Even in the prayer Jesus taught us, the "Our Father," there is the clause "give us this day our daily bread." Frankly, this is a poor English translation because the word in Greek is "epiousion," which means "supersubstantial" ... so something beyond the ordinary (MK 6:11). The point is we need this spiritual "pick-me-up" because the journey of life weighs down everyone. And just like with ordinary food, we are in constant need of nourish-

One final point...this need to repeat our exposure to the Sacrifice of the Cross, through the Mass, is also consistent with the Scripture accounts of the early Christians. For example, the Acts of the Apostles tells how the Apostles and the first converts to Christianity devoted themselves to the "breaking of the bread" (ACTS 2:42). In addition, as mentioned above, St. Paul addresses the issue of Mass with Christian community at Corinth, around the year 55 A.D. (Jesus died in 33 A.D.). The problem was that the Corinthians were celebrating Mass, but were not welcoming to everyone ... there were rival house churches. Nonetheless, notice that they believed and understood the need to celebrate the Mass frequently. "Do this in remembrance of Me" ... why, because we need it!
