2021-2022 Parish Financial Report

Enclosed in this weekend’s bulletin is a financial report for the 2021-22 fiscal year (July 1 – June 30). This was requested multiple times throughout my “Meet and Greetings,” but also is a required practice of all parishes. It’s always best to be transparent. Overall and in gratitude to your generosity, the parish is in a fine financial position.

In this report, you will see the general line items of ordinary “Income” and then “Expenditures.” We included the numbers not only from the fiscal year of 21-22, but also of 20-21 so that there is a reference point for interpretation. At the bottom of the report you will see that in both years the parish was positive for their net income. The very last line item, “Ending Balance,” shows our total assets as of June 30, 2022.

Regarding the report, you will notice a significant discrepancy of approximately \$100,000 between the two years for “Sunday & Holy Day Collections.” The main reason for this was Covid and the shutdowns. For the same reason, in the Expenditures for “Payroll Taxes & Fringe Benefits” a difference of \$29,000. These costs were forgiven during the shutdown time period. Finally in the “Capital Expense” line, this cost was mainly due to the new sound system in the church.

Due to your generosity, our parish is in the position to address needed maintenance issues. For example, the four flat roofs of the church are leaking and need to be replaced. In addition, our Air Condition units are located on two of these flat roofs, and the units are 27 years old. So, since the roofs need to be replaced, we are also going to replace the AC units. This project alone will be approximately \$150,000. Another example is that our church’s bricks need to be resealed. Bricks become porous over time and so allow moisture to come through the wall. This, in turn, causes the paint to peel. You can see some of this around the windows, especially around the rose window in the choir loft. This project will also be expensive; but, again, thanks to your generosity, we can proceed with addressing it.
