#### From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Happy Thanksgiving Week. This is so much better than "Unhappy Coronavirus Week." I don't think this holiday will catch on. Because of my encounter with the virus, I believe I am more grateful this Thanksgiving than many other years. People have asked how my quarantine days were and what kind of symptoms I had. I'd like to use my experience with the virus as my reflection for Thanksgiving.

My first indication that I might have the bug was that I lost my sense of taste and smell. Along with those losses, I lost my appetite. For over a week I had no desire to eat or drink. Sure, I lost a few pounds ,but it was strange to have to force myself to be hydrated and fed. Now that I have my senses about me (no comments please) I am grateful for the taste of hot sauce and ketchup. I am grateful for the crunchiness of carrots. I am amazed at how amazing God made food. I'm sure I will not like fish or broccoli, but tasting other foods will be like tasting them for the first time and enjoying them on a different level. It is amazing how I thank God for the smallest of things, even a radish, due to the virus.

My second indication that I had the virus was that I didn't have the same energy. During my quarantine, I took naps (I think I am going to like getting old). As a child I always took naps on the farm since I woke up early to milk the cows. A good nap in the middle of the day gave me strength to do some work and get some exercise. The problem with the virus was that I wanted to take about 4 naps a day (I was turning into Fr. Elmer. Now that is scary). It is nice to have energy and feel good. I have taken good health for granted for many years. Good health is something to thank the Lord about. During my down time, I always remembered the sick of our parishes in my prayers.

About midway through my quarantine I received a letter of isolation from the health department. It gave me permission to be isolated. As a public person as a priest for over 35 years, I almost needed a letter to say that it was alright to be away from people. I have to admit that I felt a little guilty about not working in the office or going to meetings or other ways that put me in contact with people. I missed everyone. Even when people dropped food off, I let them leave before I would retrieve the food from the stoop. I watched Mass on television, but that only made me hungrier for human contact. I realize how much of my spiritual journey and ministry depends on human contact. People are fun. People are work. People are gifts from God. And people take care of me. Besides food left at the house, many people let me know that they were praying for me. I felt and appreciate those prayers. I thank the Lord for all the people who add to my life in so many ways.

In the year 2020 everything seems to be turned on its ear. My family will not be gathering for Thanksgiving this year. But I am pretty sure I will be more thankful this year than other years. Thank you, Lord for so much. I'm pretty sure that God can use everything for His glory...even the virus.

healing ministry. It introduces The Seven Intentions of Mourning, each having its own unique purpose in helping to heal our wounds when someone we love dies.


## The Challenge Club is Off to a Great Start!

#### **Instead of a Giving Tree**

This year we will be supporting two charities: The St. Vincent de Paul Society and Christian Corner Community Center. Both of these organizations serve the poor and needy in the area. St. Vincent de Paul Society provides for the needs of over 100 households. Their list of needs includes any item found in the grocery story, except fresh or frozen foods or refrigerated foods. They need any canned or boxed foods, cereals, cake mixes, cookies, household items, soaps, shampoo, and detergents. Think of any items you need in your family. For the Christian Corner Community Center, you can adopt a family by providing an Essential Gift Bag. It includes things we take for granted and no one thinks of. By providing those items, it will help that family have a little extra money to get a loved one something they have wanted all year, but were not able to afford. Items for the Essential Gift Bag include toilet paper, paper towels, kleenex, deodorant, soap, shampoo, conditioner, laundry soap, socks of all sizes, diapers of all sizes and large Depends. They ask that those items be put in either a laundry basket or a basket of some kind that they can use and not throw away. The Christian Corner Community Center also provides a meal everyday for 50 to 100 people and hands out 50 food boxes a month. If you would like to make a cash donation, both of these organizations are 501 (c) (3). These items can be dropped off during the drive-by Live Nativity on December 6 at St. Michael's Church or at the entrances of church.
