Hi, everyone.

Rachel is a physician's assistant near Columbus. She is all flustered as I write this. She is worried about everyone else, but herself. Rachel wants to make sure Tyler, her fiancé, is not too nervous. She wants his family to feel comfortable in Mercer County (who wouldn't). She is worried that her dad, my brother will get teary-eyed. Her concern for others is the kind of person she is and that is why she is so loved. I told her that there are times when it is your time to be blessed. It is time to let God love her and Tyler instead of trying to fix everyone else. She is so used to splinting and casting other people's knees, shoulders and ankles. She needs to take the time to realize that it is time to dance a dance of life. My favorite part of a wedding is the first dance.
