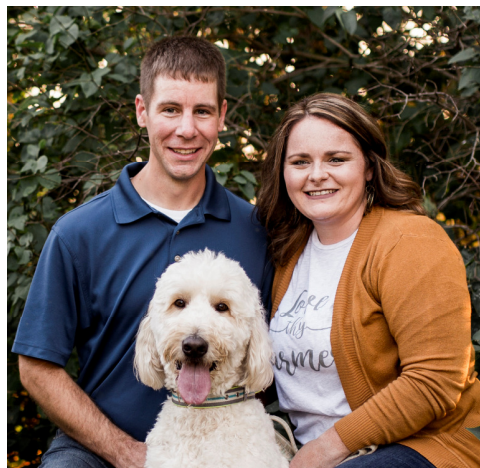
Strong Catholic Families

Cinema Night at Ft. Jennings Parish

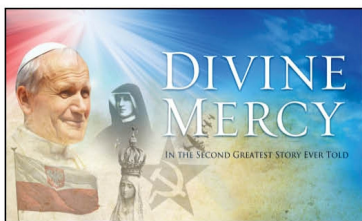
