Hearing our Lord's Voice

This weekend, I am glad to welcome Fr. Phil Smith to be with us. Phil is a good friend of mine and is the vocation director for the Diocese of Toledo. His primary task is to overlook all of our seminarians preparing for the priesthood, and to talk to young folks considering a call to the priesthood or religious life. As you can imagine, an essential question he always receives is "how do I know if this is what God wants me to do?" As you can imagine, this is not a simple question. Nonetheless our Gospel gives us a key element whenever we are trying to hear His voice: prayer.

Recall the first line of the Gospel: "Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." Our Lord stresses this point because He knows what prayer can do for us. First of all, it puts us in a position to hear His voice. If you think about it, we have so much "noise" in our lives. We have these concerns, these obligations, all these different "voices" competing for our attention. Our Lord's voice is present in the midst of all this, but it is subtle. His voice pulls at our conscience, and to give ourselves a chance to hear it, we need that proper space which is cultivated by prayer. Secondly, prayer opens us consciously to God and it keeps us in a steady/personal relationship to Him. Perhaps think of it this way: many of you know your family members well and so can predict how they would react in most situations. The reason why we know how our family members will react (their likes and dislikes) comes from spending time and communicating with them. With enough time and devotion to prayer, a similar sensitivity will arise in our hearts towards our Lord. Many of us already have this sense, we say things like "that doesn't sound right" or "I don't think this is how God wants it." This sensitivity came through learning but also through prayer. If we want to hear His voice clearly, prayer will heighten our ability.

God's message is always one we will ultimately want...let's do our part and open our souls through pray-Fr. Nathan er!
