I always claimed she had a very good guardian angel to keep her from pain and discomfort. She always had a welcoming smile and an ornery disposition. As she would motor around in her wheelchair, there might be an occasional kick to let people know that she was in the hallway. Helen helped shape our family as we soon learned that, though disabled in a number of ways, she was the person God intended her to be. She helped teach us patience when she decided to sit in the middle of a room because something did not go her way. She taught us how to communicate when words weren't available. She taught us how to look after each other because we all took turns seeing her grow and age, not being able to speak or take care of herself. Helen was an important part of the family. And now she joins her heavenly family with Mom and Dad and Kenneth, Beverly and Norman. My first thought of Helen in heaven was that she would be welcomed home by my Mom. Mom desperately wanted Helen to say just one word: MOM. She never did. My vision is that when Helen entered the pearly gates and saw Mom that she called out the one word which would make heaven even more perfect. Helen would say "Mom" with Dad looking on and they would introduce Helen to God. Helen was an important part of our family. She was number 11 of the 17. She definitely made her presence known and taught us all so much about life. It is nice to be family.

I'd like to say a big thanks to all my family here. You guys have been great. You help me celebrate when God blesses us with joyful events and you are there when we question God when we can't figure out what life is about. Our whole lives belong to God and it is easier to go through life with a family. When Jesus was asked who his family was, He replied that his family were those who did the Father's will. Thanks to so many here for "doing" for me in good times and bad. You showed God's face to me many times. It is nice to be family.

May God bless all of you for your goodness to me at birthday times and times which are hard. You have been there for me and I have seen how you have been there for others. It is nice to be family. Have a blessed week. **Fr. Mark**
