The soy comes from the Mercer County area and is shipped in blue barrels, which are put in containers and sent to Haiti. The barrels are also used to collect rain water for local use. The soy is especially beneficial to pregnant women and their unborn babies, as well as helping to

eradicate malnutrition in children. Almost 50% of Haiti's population is unable to cover their minimum daily dietary requirements and nearly 25% of children suffer from chronic malnutrition. Please support this year's Mission Fest in any way you can.
