

Fr. Nathan's Eucharistic **Article 2 of 40**

"He Found It Very Good"

How do I know what my potential is? How do I know what I am made for? How do I reach this end? Certainly there will be a nuance to each of our stories; however, there is also a common denominator. A denominator that is a necessary element for each of our stories to unfold as they are intended. This denominator is revealed in the very first page of the Bible. While we are familiar with the creation story, it is important to remember that the Bible's primary intention is not to tell us how the world was made, but rather why it was made. What is clear from the first page is that everything is made from God and for God. Our Lord is that common denominator, and this means that He is the fundamental and necessary element in understanding our purpose and reaching that end ... in other words, our full story can never be understood and discovered without Him!

While the creation story stresses this point in different ways, I will highlight three of these ways. First is with the number "seven." The Bible loves to use numbers because they help to express completeness or incompleteness. "Seven" conveys completeness. Hence, the number given to the devil is 666; thus conveying that he is absolutely incomplete, and it is repeated three times because he dared to imitate the three faces of the Trinity. So, notice with the story of creation, its "seven" days and thus expressing completeness to our Lord's plan. Notice further, what brings about the completeness to the overall plan, what happened on the seventh day: it is time with our Lord. God not only makes the picture, but also completes it. To isolate or remove God from the picture, then we are back to "6."

Secondly, the language used to describe the formation of people suggests that we can only be understood when God is in the picture. Throughout the creation story, it says God "makes" different things. But, three times it says he "created" ("bara" in Hebrew), for the creation of matter (1:1), for life (1:21), and then humanity (1:27). Bara' does not mean to create something like a cake; rather, its to make something new that was not there before. When we make things, we depend upon other things already in existence. To create something out of nothing, this is an action that only God can do. Thus, by using this term, the Bible is stressing that who we are as a person, our essence, our rights, our purpose is not and cannot be independent from God; rather, we are deeply rooted in Him. Driving this point home is the intimate detail of 2:7, where our Lord formed our bodies from the earth (the matter He created, 1:1) and breathed His life (which He created, 1:21) into us (i.e. the creation of our soul). Perhaps this whole intimate point is most beautifully expressed in our Lord's words to Jeremiah: "before I formed you in the womb I knew you" (Jer 1:5).

Thirdly, when God is fully in the picture, look at how the rest of life goes. Adam and Eve are in a lush garden, a place that is life-giving. They are told not to eat from the

tree of knowledge of good and bad...in other words, God does not even want them to be exposed to badness. There is a perfect balance between the rest of creation and Adam/Eve. Finally, the relationship between Adam and Eve is itself whole/perfect. Did you ever wonder what was the significance of the verse "they were naked, but felt no shame" (2:25)? It expresses that when God is in the picture, we don't focus on the shallow and "skindeep" level of the person; rather, we go to the heart and know that they too are a child of our Lord made in "His image and likeness" (1:27) ... that perspective is the foundation of true relationships.

"God looked at everything he had made, and he found it very good." That's the fundamental plan, a very good plan, and plan that only unfolds for each of us when our Lord has His proper place in our lives. What does our life look like when God is not in the picture? Stay tuned for next week.
