

### "Lift High the Cross"

If you look at the highest point of either Kalida or Continental's church, you will see a Cross. When you enter either church, you will see a crucifix front and center. If you participate in any liturgies at either parish, you will likely make the sign of the cross several times. Heck, some of you are wearing a cross right now. For us Catholics, we surround ourselves with crosses and this Wednesday, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. But here is a question: why do we bother with all these crosses? Why do we have them in our churches, why do we make the sign of the cross, why do we wear them?

Probably the greatest theologian of all time, St. Thomas Aquinas, said the cross speaks three clear messages. First, it's an image of God's love for us. Think about it, what clearer action could He do to express His love for us than to give up His life? His motive is clear, and He is holding nothing back. He gives it all for you.

Secondly, it's an image of our Redemption. We all know that when we offend a relationship, we have to pay some "price" to rectify our mistake, and this price is determined by what we did and whom we did it to. If you offend a friend, you have to pay the price of apologizing. If you offend your government, you might have to pay the price of a fine or jail time. Well, what about our Lord? How could we (mere humans) ever pay that price? The answer is we can't, but Jesus (who is God and man) can pay that price since He is God and can do it on our behalf since He also is human. When we approach the sacraments, we are applying those graces earned by Jesus' sacrifice, to our soul.

Thirdly, it is an image of our discipleship. If you want to do well in anything, it always requires sacrifice. If you want to succeed in school, you need to give-up time. If you want to succeed at a sport, you need to give-up comfort and work hard. And, if we want to succeed at life (i.e. discovering God's ultimate plan for us), it too requires sacrifice. Cutting out the ungodly ways and temptation and following our Lord's way.

This week, as we celebrate this Feast Day, take time before a crucifix and pray over these questions: Lord, am I showing you the same love that you have for me? Lord, am I taking seriously my errors and am I seeking your grace through the sacraments? Lord, am I making the necessary sacrifices in my life so that your plan can unfold? Let us all lift high the cross this week and beyond.
