He lets some fly while we play cards or at a meeting or when he has Mass. Hey!!! He does pick on me a lot. He is quick-witted and usually has a comment for any occasion. I kid him about his meditation time spent in a favorite recliner or the rocker in church. He says that someone has secretly put chloroform in the pillows. It is during this "meditation time" that he gets his best thoughts.

Fr. Elmer does take time to keep up with his spiritual life as he reads much. He says at his age he doesn't retain a lot, but he likes to test me on my knowledge of God and Church. We have great conversations. He calls me a theologian and I call him something I can't print in the bulletin (just kidding). Fr. Elmer has much knowledge of all parts of the world, as he has traveled extensively. He has a great knowledge of God because he prays and listens to God as he meditates (I'm sure that is why he can sleep so well because he is a pretty holy guy).

It has been my joy to have Fr. Elmer live with me. If everyone would say birthday wishes and pray a little prayer for him, my joy would be even greater.
