“You Don’t Know Where You are Going IF
You Don’t Know Where You Came From”

One of the realities of our lives is that we are repetitive by nature. We are people of habit, and while there can be pitfalls in this, in general this is a good thing. Good habits we call virtue, and by being repetitive, it allows us to organize, develop, and grow into something great. For example, if you think of your home, there is a good repetitive pattern to its structure (e.g. the studs in the wall are spaced so far apart), and due to this you have a great/firm home. We (for the most part) know this, and it's why we study history ... not to learn random facts; but, to learn about ourselves. As the saying goes, “You don’t know where you are going if you don’t know where you came from.” Most, if not all, the problems we face today are not completely new dynamics; but rather, the old issues with a new appearance. Therefore, we look backwards in order to go forward. Heck, how many times will coaches make reference to a previous practice/game so that their players can learn from a mistake? Similarly, we as Catholics do this at Mass. We go back to the ancient Scriptures and prayers because they speak to who we are as a person and to the deep yearning of our hearts. The main difference between Mass and with pure history is that we are not simply looking at details, but it is through this tradition that we encounter our Lord and He speaks to us. Yes we learn, but more importantly we enter into deeper communion with our Lord.

I share this brief reflection on tradition, because one of the great traditions of both of Kalida and Continental is our CCD program. CCD is really a tradition that puts us in touch with the tradition of our faith. Just like a relationship with a person, if you don’t learn about that person, that relationship is shallow and thus can easily fade away. CCD aims to help our young students to learn about our Lord and His ways, so that they can grow closer to Him. As a consequence of this communion, they become stronger themselves! In other words, CCD aims to help students look back, so that they can go forward. Heck, how would our communities of Kalida and Continental look if it wasn’t for the decades upon decades of young people growing through CCD?

Of course when you think of the example of the coach talking with the players, it may not always be the immediate most enjoyable thing to do. But, not all immediate enjoyable things are in our best interest (e.g. skipping work on Monday). Similarly, CCD may not always be the most enjoyable or convenient thing to do; but, isn’t that true with any important work/job? Let me put it this way, in my nine years as a priest I have not encountered a sane person who can truthfully say “I am better off now since I didn’t go to CCD.” I share this thought because everyone has demanding and pressing schedules, and often for the sake of relief the temptation is to sacrifice the spiritual side. Well, if we look backwards, that is never in our immediate or long-term best interest. It is only by allowing the spiritual side to have first priority, do we truly go forward.

On a side note, one of the great traditions of Kalida is upon us: the Pioneer Days. What a great opportunity to stop and think of our family and neighbors who came before us and helped establish and build this great community. Let us pray that by looking back at our history, we may be inspired to continue to follow our Lord, and that we can proceed forward with confidence!
