From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. Today was another step in being "normal" for our religious education. For the past year and a half, we were not allowed to gather as a whole school to share in prayer for Mass. This morning at St. Michael's, we gathered grades one through eight to give thanks to God. The theme, besides being our first school Mass, was that today is the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. This is right up my alley, as I have always seen God's presence in the wonder of creation. As a farmer, I have seen God's hand in creation in many ways. I have seen a good crop of wheat being 50 bushels per acre, when I was young, to this year's harvest of being over 100 bushels per acre. I think of my Dad's hope that all people in the world having enough to eat. By caring for the earth and water, we are actually caring for people of today and the future.

When I was young, there were no eagles around Grand Lake St. Mary's. Hunting and herbicides reduced them to zero. After conservation measures were put into place, eagles are now flourishing in Mercer and Putnam Counties. To care for creation creates more opportunities for beauty. Appreciation of beauty leads to appreciation of God's gifts.

At today's Mass with the young people of the parish, I saw much beauty. To gather as a family warms my heart. To appreciate the youngest and oldest shows the dignity of God in each of us. People are a special creation as we are created in God's image. I especially liked the voices of our young people this morning. As they sang, the church rang out with praise for God. If we are called to care for God's creation, we are certainly called to care for each other. If we have a proper respect for God's creation, we share in the responsibility to care for the youngest to the oldest. We are able to see God's face in each person we meet. We are able to care for the unborn because we are made to care and love each other because we are from God.

Today was a cooler day, so I took time to care for creation by just appreciating the gift that creation is. I took in butterflies and ants. I enjoyed snap dragons and petunias. I listened for the blue jays and song sparrows. I walked out with a sweater on, as I was up early. It was nice to feel a cool breeze. I said a prayer for the crops as I looked at the beans and corn ripen in the fields. Dear God, may all the people in the world have enough to eat. And I tried to see the good in each person I met. I tried to see with new eyes people I see every day. If we don't recognize our neighbor, there is no way to care for them. Lord, open my eyes to all creation, especially the people in my life.

One final thought. It is one thing to recognize God's creation so that we can care for it. It is another to recognize how God cares for us. God sent His Son so that we would know his care and love. Even though we are not perfect, He loves us so perfectly. If He cares for the sparrow, He surely cares for us. He lifts up the lowly to the heights. Let us care as God cares for us. With Pioneer Days coming up, let us care for those in our community and for those who visit out community. We are made in His image. As He cares for us, let us care for each other.
