From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi and welcome to Pioneer Weekend. Pioneer literally takes over the town. Streets are closed and traffic is shut down. Children are thinking of free bicycles and learning is shut down. Almost the same thing happens in Continental in a couple of weeks at the Fall Festival. Welcome to all those who come back to see old friends and eat food that brings back memories. There must be some reason to eat French fries that are dripping in grease or eat an elephant ear that should have a warning on it. For some reason, we all come back. I think there is something hidden in the weekend that follows Labor Day. People begin to crave social burgers and sitting down to play Bingo. Cake wheels have a draw that brings in patrons, just to hear the clicking of the wheel. Goldfish and turtles may have gone by the wayside, but there is something that calls us back. The situation brings back a Robert Palmer song, "You're gonna have to face it, you're addicted to Pioneer." Those may not be the exact lyrics, but you get the idea. Some of the adults are current Catholics who want to know more about their religion. Learning about the Catholic faith is different on an adult level than what it was when we learned it before Confirmation. Many people ask questions they would have never asked as a teenager. We have persons of different faith traditions who are looking at the Catholic tradition to help them on their journey to find and celebrate their love of God. The RCIA is a good program for these people to investigate their faith and ask lots of questions also. We have a good time and all are welcome. It is not too late to join. One last thought: I've got "Addicted to Love" on my mind. I believe that God has put his spark of love in us that is stronger than any call for social burgers or Bingo. Love calls us more than French Fries or cake wheels. God seems addicted to us and won't leave us alone. He just wants to love us. I believe that once we know His love, we become addicted too.
