from the SUPREME KNIGHT



In 2016, the Knights of Columbus again set records for charitable giving and hours volunteered, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson told Knights of Columbus jurisdiction leaders during the opening business session of the 2017 Organizational Meeting of State Deputies. “We reached new heights in 2016,” the supreme knight said. According to the figures from the 2016 Fraternal Survey, Knights gave \$177,500,673 in charitable donations. This is a more than \$2.4 million increase over the 2015 donations. In addition, the Knights volunteered 75,112,694 hours to charitable initiatives, up from the 2015 total of 73 million hours.

The top 10 jurisdictions in charitable giving for 2016 were Texas with \$9.1 million, followed by California, Michigan, Illinois, Florida, Ontario, Missouri, New York, New Jersey and Wisconsin.

The top 10 in volunteer hours were Texas with 5.5 million hours, followed by Luzon North, Florida, California, Illinois, Luzon South, Ontario, Visayas, Pennsylvania and Québec.
