3. Type and email the recipe, your name and send all digital photos to kalida.stmichaelyouth@bright.net. Jill will reply that she received your email, so make sure you get a reply. To ensure accuracy, all recipes must be typed. We will copy and paste the text into the cookbook.
4. **Deadline is Monday, September 30, 2019.** That gives you a little over two months! Our goal is to have the cookbooks ready by early December so you can utilize them for Christmas gatherings (or give as a gift).
5. **Feeling overwhelmed?** Don't have a camera or phone to take a picture? Can't email? Don't let this stop you...we're here to help! Call us at 419-532-3474. We can take the picture for you. Fr. Mark or Kevin both say they are willing to taste-test, too!
6. This is for all parishioners of all ages, and both men and women. We want to include as many recipes as possible from as many families as we can. You can submit up to three recipes, but list them in order of priority, as we may only be able to print one or two. Make sure to list the category of your submission from the following list: **appetizers, soups & salads, vegetables/sides, main dishes, breads, desserts or miscellaneous.**

From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. This Saturday marks the 50th anniversary of Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landing on the moon. For me, July 20 became one of those benchmark times in my life. I remember watching and hoping and hearing those words about small steps for a man and a giant leap for mankind. 1966 was the end of a decade of change and a decade of hope. I lived through a number of benchmark situations in the 60s. I remember well the assassinations of John and Bobby Kennedy and Martin Luther King, Jr. I remember well the salute at the Olympics in Mexico City and race riots on television. I remember the Vietnam War with protests and draft dodgers going to Canada. The 1960s were very memorable for me and the landing on the moon gave me a sense that good things were possible. It might have been a small step for Neil Armstrong (that is why he wanted to say, "a man," but it came out, "man," but it was the possibility for a giant leap for all of us. There might have been turmoil all around, but the landing on the moon gave possibilities that were out of this world. The landing on the moon was small compared to what might be.

I still feel that way. I know that there is turmoil in this world. Words of hate and division point that out vividly. Acts of violence and use of abusive words through social media might be benchmarks for this generation. But I still believe in a small step helping us leap to something larger, something out of this world. When I see the steps of children running to participate in Vacation Bible School, hope is renewed in me. When children raise their fists and say, "God is good" during one of the VBS songs, it brings me to another dimension of hope. Those raised children's voices and fists are stronger than the fists of protests in 1968 at Mexico City.

I believe in small steps of love overcoming the hatred of the world. Ask the man helped by the Good Samaritan. Ask a Christian when we think about a child born in Bethlehem. God loves us greatly, but knows that when we make small steps of love, it changes everything. God's love is out of this world.

When you look at the moon on this golden anniversary year, take a small step toward God. It will be a giant leap for all of us. Have a blessed week.
