## From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone, and thanks to everyone who has been praying for good weather. There is still no word on when the boiler for the church will be done in Kalida. I really appreciate the Indian Summer weather. Keep those prayers coming.

This week is family week for our deanery. St. Michael's is hosting a night on families, put on by the Diocese of Toledo. Wednesday night, at 7:00 p.m., persons from around the county will join in song, prayer and celebration in church to follow up on Pope Francis' visit to the United States. There will be special presentations by the Gerten family who attended the Philadelphia group from the diocese, Bishop Daniel Thomas (by video) and music from special performers. There will be time to pray for families. All are invited to this special presentation. Cookies and fellowship will follow in the church basement.

With family in mind, I have done lots of reflection on my own family. I want to let you all know that my family is perfect (perfect angels, perfect idiots and a few other perfects that I can't put in the bulletin). My family shared a lot. With six people in a room, and three people in a bed, we shared lots of germs. If one got the flu, it didn't take long before the whole family was infected. Mom always said she was too busy to get sick. I think now of all the sheets that needed washed, buckets that needed emptied and tender loving care that needed delivered. Being in a family requires a nursing degree to help make the sick better.

I wonder how many arguments mom and dad had to decide upon regarding us kids. This child got one more French fry or piece of chicken. This one worked a bit harder than another child. Santa brought one more gift to the youngest, and it just wasn't fair. To be a family requires a degree in law to try to make things fair. We soon learned that things were never going to be equal (chickens don't have equal parts; someone had to eat the neck) and that justice meant taking care of the youngest or my sister, who is disabled.

Family meant that you needed a good sense of being together. There were times we would fit 13 in a car (not a station wagon). If you were ever going to visit your favorite cousins, concessions had to be made. In the car, you didn't always get the window seat unless you were the last one who had the flu and needed to be close to a window, for obvious reasons. There was little room for personal space and more consideration for family space. In a family like mine, you had to be a Tetris or Candy Crush expert so that we would all fit in a car and see the world.

In our big family, we had to develop our taste buds. Whatever mom made for dinner is what we ate, no matter what was made. Diets of liver, lard bread, rabbit and squirrel and tongue were on the menu. There was never an extra peanut butter and jelly sandwich if we didn't care for the evening meal. We didn't grow peanuts, so no peanut butter. As a family, we learned that not everyone has the same tastes, but all are hungry.

In a big family, we learned to pray. There were always things to pray about. I can't tell you how many times I prayed for a pig or fair calf. I prayed for rain and sun. I prayed for wheat and corn and hay to dry in time to get it in the barn. But that was nothing compared to praying for family. Mom and Dad prayed for teenagers to grow up. We

prayed when someone got hurt in a farm accident. I prayed with a smile on my face as I brought that last load of corn in from the field. Families pray because they are families.

When I went off to seminary and learned that I had a big church family, lessons learned about my blood family came in handy. Church is easy compared to living in my family (just kidding). It takes a lot to make a family, but it is worth it. In this year of family, know that we are all called to be one family, with God as Father. Take time this week to appreciate what family really means.
