From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Hi, everyone. I'm still on a little high after baptizing a grand nephew, Dominic. The scene was beautiful as two younger siblings wanted to "help" in the best, or should I say, the worst way. Instead of sitting in the pew, they wanted to stand with the parents and godparents as they professed their faith. They wanted to touch their brother as the water was poured and cried when Dominic cried as cold water streamed down his head. The siblings kissed the forehead of Dominic after chrism was put on to mark him as priest, prophet and king. By the end of the ceremony the siblings smelled with perfumed oil as much as the baby. My sister-in-law will not let me put the baptismal candle incident in print. And I thought to myself that if Baptism is the immersion of God's life in the child and Dominic's life into the life of our God, those little ones have the right understanding. Because of God's great love we want to be near that love always. All the symbols are just symbols until we put what those symbols mean into our lives. I smiled at the sweetness of the children wanting to be involved in the ceremony. I smiled even more to think that they were already participating in God's life and I have such hope that they will live in that faith forever. And I needed that little high as this week was marked with sadness due to sickness and death. Hearts get broken by such tragedies. The question of where is God in all this passes through our minds. When the tough times of life come into my life, I turn to what I know for sure: God loves me. I may not understand all the ways of God but I do understand being loved. My thoughts are not His thoughts but being loved goes beyond what my simple mind can take in. Knowing with head and heart that He loves me like, "I'm His favorite" allows me to trust Him when life does not make sense. He loves us all like we are His favorites. There are times I just have to turn things over to God. And that is not easy for me because I believe I can handle most things by myself. As I put that down in writing, that sounds pretty arrogant. Maybe I and we need God more than we give God credit for. And that is just why we need Baptism to wash away the original sin of believing we don't need God and we try to become God ourselves. It is good to put our burdens on the Lord as the load is much too heavy for us to carry or figure out. It is easy to find God when things are going well. It is easy to question God when life is not going well. The fact that we go to God at both times reminds me that God is all in all. As Dominic was and is immersed in the life of our God, may all of us be covered with the love of God which moves us beyond doubt but to love even more. Have a blessed week everyone.
